ing houses for people in Salem. Instead we should focus our efforts on building something truly helpful to the larger community. We should build an ark. I figure that the unified brain-trust of Saint

Paul's might just be able to supply the wood, the know-how, and even the animals to fill the thing. We'll lay out the keel in the parking lot, clear some timber from behind the church to defray costs, and then let the rains continue. We'll be ready for whatever comes our way! (I'm starting to understand why the good people of the Pacific Northwest need so much darned coffee.)

While the rain has everyone a little dreary these days, there is something remarkably peaceful and restorative

about these drizzly June days. As I look out from the house on our verdant lawn I've had more time to read and consider the work of this summer at Saint Paul's. Summer is a great time for sabbath and rest after a deeply rewarding fall, winter and spring, but it's also a great time to plan and prepare. There are two books I've really taken a shine to in the last several weeks. The first is Barbara Brown Taylor's deeply moving *An Altar in the World* and Steve Sjogren's challenging *Conspiracy of Kindness*. I'm finding that when thinking about preparing for the future life of St. Paul's (sans precipitation) that these two great books have a lot to teach us.

Barbara Brown Taylor's Altar is a fascinating look at how our faith can deepen in places outside of the walls of the church. She points to those places in our life that aren't circumscribed by stained glass and altar linen, but which nevertheless become places where we find God.

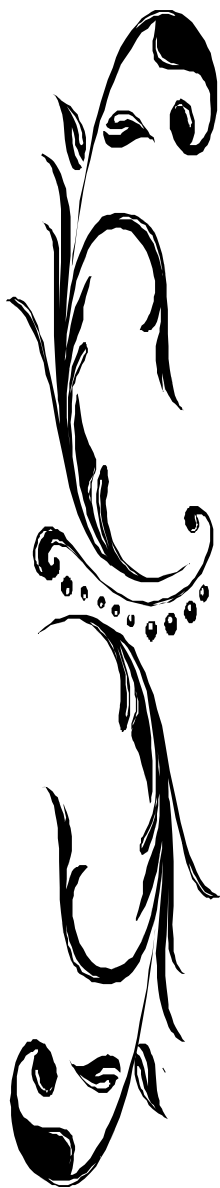
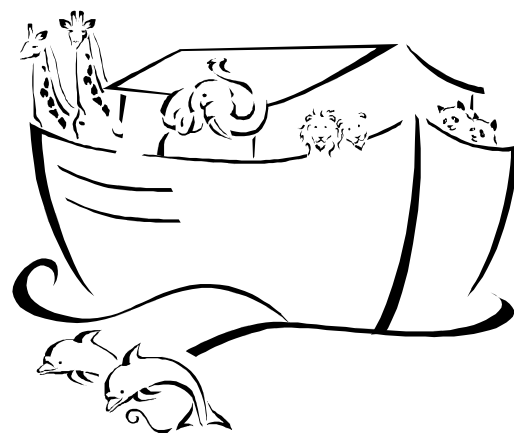

It's a wonderful little book that reminds us that as human beings every moment of our life is lived in the presence and love of God. Life is filled with everyday holiness if we're ready to look for it. She teaches the reader that every moment of life is a gift and potential conduit for the grace of God. After all, life is short.

Steve Sjogren's *Conspiracy of Kindness* is a book about how we live out our faith so that other people can experience God's love through us. This is a wonderful little book that introduces the reader to a notion called servant evangelism. Though evangelism tends to conjure up images of Billy Graham and sandwich-board clad crazy people, Sjorgen reminds us that Christianity is the story of God's love for the world. He goes on to say that the only way the world can hear that story of God's love (evangelism) is through God's people acting out in ways that reflect that love. Sjorgen then goes on to give some remarkably simple and effective advice for sharing God's love in the world by meeting everyday needs of people close to the parish. It's a breath of fresh air in the context of neighborhood parishes just like ours.

These notions of “everyday holiness” and our call to reach out to meet “everyday needs” represent two exciting themes for the coming fall at St. Paul's. They are two great ways to prepare our souls for the “flood” of grace that God promises the Church in every age. And while we might not be building a literal ark in the parking lot, the church is always called to be an ark in a world tossed to and fro by the currents and riptides of everyday living. I give thanks to God that we are building this ark together. Have a blessed summer Saint Paul's!

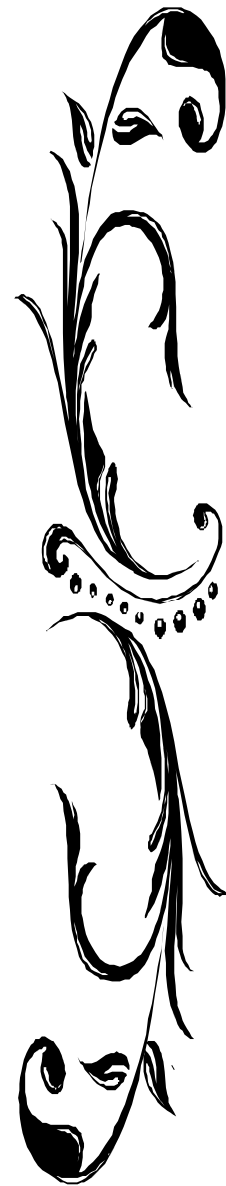

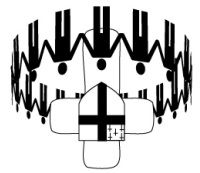
