Risen Indeed

On Easter night in the town of Scranton, Pennsylvania, while sitting in a very comfortable restaurant, the monks of Mt. Athos monastery introduced America and the crew of 60 Minutes to their life and devotion. I looked on in awe with millions of other Americans as the great treasures of art and devotion were paraded in front of the camera, and pilgrims took turns being blessed by priest and relic alike. It was indeed beautiful to see the ancient treasures of one of the most holy monasteries in Eastern Christianity on American television on Easter night.

It made me think about the Easter and Lent we just experienced at Saint Paul's. Some of us kept a remarkably strict Lent, while others of us tried and failed to fast or take on some discipline. No matter if we had a 'successful' Lent or not, we then gathered for some very unique and liturgically circumscribed services that

only happen once every year. Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday and the Stripping of the Altar, the Stations of the Cross, and the Great Vigil of Easter transported us to different types of worship and devotion. Like Mt. Athos, these services were beautiful and set aside by geography and time. They were special, beautiful and they were meant to remove us from the normal world of mundane necessity and rote devotion. Like the 60 Minutes crew visiting Mt. Athos, we were just visiting the Holy Mountain of Lent and Holy Week.

Now that we have come down "the mountain" we come to the truly hard work of Easter. Our music will return to normal, our prayers will be reliable and the week to week things of worship will return. How will we bring our learnings from Lent and Holy Week into Easter and the Ordinary time that will soon be ours? How will you share the joy and wonder of what you have seen and heard? Can we

keep the joy and wonder of the acclamation, "Christ is Risen! The Lord is Risen indeed!" our enduring hymn for the weeks ahead?

It's the story that shapes our faith and our work in the world. For us to move on without the great acclamation on our lips and back into the "routine" would be most unfortunate. Let us work to hold the acclamation close to our hearts and let it sink deeply into your soul, "the Lord is Risen indeed!"

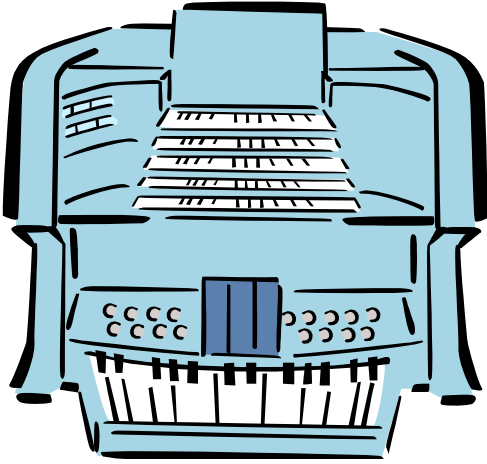

Lent—It's About the Journey

To quote Peggy Lee, as I am known to do, “Is that all there is?”

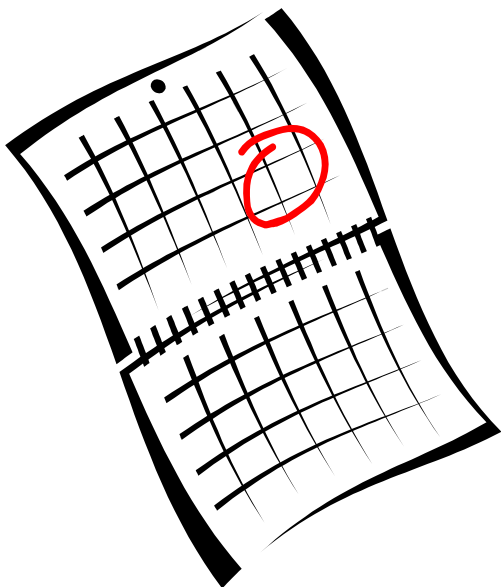
